Taxes-What Good Are They?

They spread the cost of infrastructure projects to all users of the infrastructure enabling a lot of funding of projects for very little expense to local folks when the taxes are sales taxed based.

Case in point.

Saturday night, we had our 45th Annual Installation and Awards dinner at the Doubletree in Rohnert Park. Congrats to the honorees (Jeanine Clary of Argonaut for Volunteer of the Year, Raul Valdivia of Valdivia Trucking for Affiliate of the Year, Dick Ghilotti of Ghilotti Construction Company for Contractor of the Year, Rob Lee of Team Ghilotti for Hermsmeyer Hall of Fame Induction, and the family of Ed Winters for Posthumous Hermsmeyer Hall of Fame induction), and during acceptance speeches, Dick Ghilotti mentioned Jim Ghilotti and his effort to get "Three Lanes All The Way" passed which turned into Measure M some 20 years ago. The reference to Jimmy G (no not the quarterback!), reminded me of our success in getting Measure DD the Go Sonoma Act passed a few years ago that will replace Measure A when that tax measure "sunsets" in 2024. I wanted to say a few words about how some tax measures do more good than harm.

Measure M has done a tremendous amount of good in its 20 years of so since passing with approval of the voters. The fact that we became a "self-help" County by taxing ourselves to fix our roads, was a HUGE decision by taxpayers. What becoming a self help County (as relates to taxing ourselves and spending those tax revenues on our roadways) did for Sonoma County, is it leveraged us into a position to get matching funds from the State and Feds that would have simply gone elsewhere. I know, some of my conservative friends are mumbling to themselves right now saying "we pay enough in taxes, we should not have to pay more-leverage or no leverage". I agree with them, but those taxes we pay to the State and Feds are there and they are not going away. My argument in favor of Measure DD was "we are paying taxes already, let's pay just a bit more and get big returns on that investment back in the County". The voters saw the logic in that and voted twice to tax themselves. Huge dividends.

Does anyone recall how bad Highway 101 was to travel 15 years ago? Frontage roads entering and exiting from Petaluma to Novato, created unnecessary danger and old bridges that were worn out. Not to mention big projects to sustain our GBI's and GCC's for a few years. Hundreds of local workers, if not thousands, benefitted from getting on those projects, making good prevailing wages, and choosing to spend those paychecks locally. Obviously, the ownership of the two biggest firms to do those projects live locally so the profits stayed (for the most part) right here in Sonoma and Marin Counties. Think of all the suppliers and truckers, concrete suppliers, etc. that also benefited. I am guessing a dollar spent with Measure M tax dollars generated around \$7 of economic activity for every \$1 of tax money raised. Studies exist that can back that claim up.

So we are now seeing another source of income become available to our industry from the raising of bridge tolls several years ago. After the tax advocate group Jarvis challenged the Regional Measure 3 in court, all those bridge tolls just collected and did not get distributed. Now that the Supreme Court ruled against the bridge toll increase, those funds will begin to be distributed very soon. The biggest immediate beneficiaries of those dollars? Highway 37 and the SMART extension to Windsor and Healdsburg.

A lot of credit goes to the taxpayers. But I like to remind folks that yours truly was the Measure DD Committee Chair that worked very hard to get another 20 years of ¼ cents sales tax in place to help fund road and bridge repair and support public transportation issues that go to relieving road use by individual drivers. I am very proud of my and the ECA's advocacy on Measure DD and I am very grateful for the ECA Board and members stepping up to support a tax measure that will turn out to do a whole lot of good for a lot of folks!

The ECA also supported and endorsed RM3 (Regional Measure 3) and with a tremendous push by Jimmy Ghilotti many years ago, the first big tax measure (Measure M) was passed that is credited with \$1 billion worth of work done to the Highway 101 corridor.

Taxes-What Good Are They? Lots of good can come from focused and well managed tax measures. I am proud to work for the ECA who has the good political sense to know how helping to tax ourselves has worked out in a big way to help ourselves far beyond the ¼ cents sales tax we have paid! Let's never lose sight of the fact that this is a very inefficient way to raise money for projects though. The government is very good at wasting dollars!




The Law Book features a summary of new contracting laws that became effective on January 1, 2023.

The all-inclusive book details CSLB's history and mission and offers specialized sections about becoming a licensed contractor, maintaining a license, home improvement contracting requirements, business management, and safety regulations. It also contains California's Business and Professions Code and other construction-related state codes, and Contractors State License Law rules and regulations.

"The 2023 Law Book is an essential guide for members of the California construction industry," said David Fogt, CSLB Registrar. "This tool can help current contractors manage their business and help potential contractors get information on how to obtain a license."
