

"School Construction-Lease

Leaseback-Don't Do It!"



This has, and is, and will, affect many of our ECA members that participate in school construction projects.

The basic scheme allowed school districts to lease a school site to a contractor for a nominal sum, then the school district contracts with the contractor to build the improvements for a specific amount paid for by leasing back the school site from the contractor over a period of time (sometimes several decades).

This "Soapbox" has dealt with this issue for many years (it is so complicated, and it has been so "up in the air", I have only written about it two or three times-each time warning contractors they might build the projects, get paid for their contract, and if the courts rule this is an illegal way of issuing the work without bidding on it, the contractor could be forced to give the district back all of their contract money-my consistent message has been "Don't Do It").

At this point, the "lease-leaseback" method of no-bid construction award is deemed illegal by the State Supreme Court. I am sure there will be some

other legal issues that come from this, such as possibly holding contractors harmless. Those issues have not been adjudicated yet.

Critical Incident Procedures

Purpose: To develop a plan to be used in the event of a serious injury or death in the workplace.

Cal-OSHA Requirements:

A report must be made immediately by telephone (within 8 hours) to a district office. Employers are allowed 24 hours if they can show that circumstances prevented the report from being made in 8 hours. Note: A serious injury or illness is defined as one that requires inpatient hospitalization for more than 24 hours of care other than medical observation or as one in which an employee suffers a loss of a member of the body or a serious degree of permanent disfigurement.





Expert COVID-19 Safety info Available at a Discount

The Shelter in Place Orders issued by County Heath Officers in Sonoma, Napa, and Mendocino - as well as the Governor, have highlighted for the building industry the need for all contractors to have an up-to-date written COVID -19 Exposure Control Plan.





