What Is ECA Up To?

As we near the end of 2023, it seems appropriate to let our members know what we are up to. Despite being in uncertain and dangerous times from a global perspective, locally we are in a pretty decent spot. Here is a summary of what the ECA is doing:

- As we near the year end, we are pleased to report that our financial position is as solid as it has been for some time. We have adequate cash on hand to sustain our operation, we are not raising dues or event prices, and our membership seems stable if not growing slightly.
- 2. We have our Officers and our Board of Directors in place for 2024 and our leadership is solid, committed, and experienced. ECA members are in good hands!
- 3. We have continuity of staff. Our Executive Vice President, Membership Services Director, and our bookkeeper have all been with the ECA for 13.5 years, 16.5 years and 12 years respectively. That is great experience in operations and wonderful connectivity to our membership. John, Mary and Cheryl are indeed nearing retirement age, but none of the three of us are looking to retire in the near future. We have begun succession planning by hiring a consultant that will lay out a short-term succession plan (for unplanned vacancies in Executive Vice President position) as well as a long-term succession plan (for the orderly transition of the EVP position in the future). Succession planning is critical to the soundness of any organization, and the ECA is taking proactive steps to ensure a smooth transition upon the inevitable retirements of staff.

- Our events continue to be well attended and reasonably priced. Although the ECA Board of Directors always review whether to "keep, discard or modify" the events we host each year, I do not anticipate major changes to what has proved successful over the years. The ECA is anticipating hosting the Installation and Awards Dinner on February 24th, Public Officials Night on April 11, the Father's Day Show & Shine Car Show on June 16, the ECA Golf Tournament on July 19th, and the ECA Days of Wine and Dozers annual Auction in September date TBD.
- The ECA continues its role in various committees and associations and no change is anticipated because the influence, and collaboration amongst business-friendly groups has never been more important than today. The ECA believes its members should focus on running their business and let the ECA be "at the table" for policy and regulation influence.
- The various groups the ECA participates with on a regular basis include the Sonoma County Alliance, The Construction Coalition, the Sonoma County Business and Agricultural Consortium, the Sonoma County Transportation Authority, the Santa Rosa Metro Chamber, the North Coast Builders Exchange, the Sonoma County Farm Bureau, and several other groups. In addition, the ECA meets every month with City of Santa Rosa City Manager Markeshia Smith, as well as regular meetings with Sonoma County Supervisors and staff at SMART, Sonoma County PRMD, Sonoma County Transportation and Public Works, City of Santa Rosa Transportation and Public Works, and the City of Santa Rosa Utilities.
- ECA will continue to offer special focused meetings on issues that are of great importance to engineering contracting industry participants. On November 7, 2023, the ECA is hosting a conversation with former North Coast Water Board Chairman David Noren on how to operate in an ever increasingly hostile regulatory environment. Given the recent announcement of a possible \$8 million plus fine for stormwater discharge issues by the North Coat Water Board, the timeliness of this seminar could not be more appropriate. - The annual General Membership Meeting is held every November and in 2023 the topical discussion is also very important as there is ongoing negotiation to remove several dams in Mendocino County that have supplied Sonoma County with around 20% of our water resources for nearly a century. - The ECA has initiated a Membership Drive with Keith Woods doing the "heavy lifting" of contacting and follow up information to contractors and suppliers and engineers that would benefit the ECA by being members and by getting return on investment for their membership. 




COMMITTEE NEWS
