

FOSTERING RELATIONSHIPS



Condition 146 was part of the Environmental Impact Report that was required of the developer and owner when they submitted their planned development. The EIR is reviewed, discussed, and approved with "conditions". Contractors generally do not see the EIR as part of their bid package to the owner/ developer/GC/or Engineer. The plans that the sitework contractor had should have had the "Condition 146" and all other pertinent conditions from the EIR included in "notes" so the contractor can give a complete bid on the scope of work. Apparently, the requirement for new equipment was not included so our ECA member did not know about this. Although it is not a problem for them to comply, the question as to where the compliance requirement came from was the concern.

I wanted to bring this up as an example of the benefit of being a member of the ECA. As a follow up, I have asked Tennis Wick to institute a policy that includes checking the plans when submitted to ensure inclusion of any EIR conditions required. The County will also be working on a policy that the EIR conditions will be more clearly communicated in the future.

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






COMMITTEE NEWS
