Hey-I am only human---



COMMITTEE NEWS CONTINUED

ECA Specification Committee-the ECA Spec Committee, led by Dale Smith and Casey Wood, met on November 15, 2023. The ECA Spec Committee meets every other month on the 4th Wednesday of the month-next meeting is January 24 from 4-5:30pm at NCBE Board room.

Our meeting was sparsely attended by ECA members despite having very pertinent issues to discuss:

- Conditions of Approval that the County of Sonoma must consider before issuing grading and building permits. John Mack from SOCO was on hand to explain the process of developers having to do Environmental Impact Reports due to CEQA requirements and what that means to contractors bidding on those projects. Engineers must be transparent and disclose meaningful conditions to contractors bidding on both private and public projects. Thanks to John Mack for clarifying this issue for us!
- 2. We also had Gabe Osborn and several City of Santa Rosa staffers (Flannery Banks and Cleve Gurney) present revisions to the City of Santa Rosa Stormwater Standards. Gabe and his team asked that the ECA discuss the changes, go back and review them in detail, and provide comments back to Gabe before the end of 2023 so the city can modify the standards before presenting them to the BPUC and then to the City Council to be adopted. Gabe already asked ACEC for their engineering and design comments and is looking to the ECA for comments that have to do with: a) constructability, b) costs, and c) the impact to bidders on whether the City of SR projects are made less desirable to bid on due to the Stormwater Standard changes. I will be sending out 4-5 requests to several contractors, one supplier, and an engineer for their review and comments.
- 3. I want to note that the "desirability of bidding" to the City of SR continues to be a common theme both for Santa Rosa, and for Petaluma and Sonoma County as well. All these municipalities have managed their contracts in a way that the ECA would like to see changed. Specifically, the ECA wants less retention dollars to be withheld, as well as faster and more efficient closeout of projects, and faster field decisions made when differing site conditions arise. I will be meeting with the Mayor of Petaluma soon to discuss these very issues. ECA is working to improve our project delivery to benefit our own contractors, the municipalities, and ultimately-the rate payers so their dollars go farther and are not spent on unnecessary delays and obstacles to completing the projects.

ECA Executive Committee Meeting-next meeting is on Tuesday January 23, 2024, at 11:00 am. The Exec Committee meets every 4th Tuesday of the month in 2024 at 11:00-12:00 in the small NCBE conference room.

<u>ECA Board of Director Meeting-</u>next meeting will be held January 23, 2024, from 12-2:00pm. The Board of Directors meets every 4th Tuesday of the month from 12-1:30 pm in the NCBE main board room.

<u>ECA Community Relations Committee</u>-Chaired by Lacey Torkelson Smith, meets when there is a specific project to consider. The CR Committee will next meet and present two projects at our February Board meeting (Feb 27, 2024, from 12:00 to 1:30pm). Potential projects include the Children's Museum and the Boys and Girls Club of Healdsburg.
