

Cash is King!



You can only control what you can control, right?

With the tight credit market, and somewhat tight bid market, it might be time to have companies review how they go about closing out contracts and getting their final payment without a long drawn-out process. After many projects that I ran in the past that did not close out quickly, I look back and the process could have been better had we:

- 1. Reviewed the scope sheets and verified delivery times for submittals and fabrication prior to writing the purchase order or subcontract.
- 2. Do a better job of locking in our subcontractors to our overall schedule-this includes submission of insurance docs, submittals, warranties, and Operation and Maintenance manuals.
- 3. Make sure change orders and quantities are accurate, and all the changes and quantities that can be agreed upon are closed out, and are done so before the end of the project
- If the owner delays a submittal by taking more time than the specs allow for review, put them on notice for delay. Make sure YOU OWN THE FLOAT! Don't let the owner jack you around by claiming the project owns the float. There are means and methods tricks to make sure the owner refuses responsibility for how you perform the work that puts the schedule

float back into your ownership. This is important with bad owners.

- Use suppliers and subs you know so terms and schedules are easy to assimilate.
- Don't wait on as-builts, insurance certs, warranties, and other close out docs. Get them early and make sure they are outlined on your schedule.

Organization, communication, follow-up, and being accurate are the key components to a successful closing out of a project. Here is a link to a really good (in my opinion) article on closing out a project-The Construction Closeout Process Explained | Procore.

For many of you ECA contractors, mechanical equipment may not be an integral part of your typical contracts-but MSDS sheets are, and lien releases are, and warranties are still needed. Your contract team need to address the timing of all of those as well as certified payroll documents right up front.

I keep hearing from small contractors that they have 10 projects going at once and they have trouble keeping all of them straight with getting closed out. My suggestion is to spend more time up front and organize your plan of writing subcontracts, purchase orders and getting all documentation on the schedule up front. When it comes down to delivering the product and getting lien releases and other docs, your life will be far easier! Work smarter not harder!



COMMITTEE NEWS


