Building the Pyramid in California

Back in 2008, California voters approved \$9 billion in state bond sales to fund a high-speed train from Los Angeles to San Francisco that would be in place by 2030 and that would travel over 200 mph and shorten the trip to less than three hours.

After spending over \$5 billion the Train From Nowhere to Nowhere (TFNTN), is now scaled back to 172 miles to connect a few cities in the Central Valley (<u>Train to nowhere: can California's high-speed rail project ever get back on track?</u>] California | The Guardian).


