The Trend Is Not Our Friend!

I know I have to be careful to not piss off those that are allocating where our tax dollars go, but in some very obvious cases, we are not getting the truth. Duh. Hey "Captain Obvious", what do you mean?

I mean our fuel taxes are way more than any other state and those fuel taxes fund (in a major way) our road and bridge repairs. Yet our road quality is not getting that much better in the Bay Area.

I know the City of Santa Rosa is spending some \$44 million on road repairs right now - Santa Rosa plowing \$44 million into 4 major road projects underway through early 2024 | PD Plus (pressdemocrat.com)

Here is what is true:

I have gathered a map of how much fuel tax you pay in the Bay Area and contrasted that with the Pavement Condition Index of our roads in the Bay Area. Based on the two factual reports, my conclusion is -

We are not spending enough on our roads.

California pays more in fuel excise taxes than any other state. Here is a map showing taxes state by state. California pays 77 cents on each gallon of fuel in excise taxes.



In spite of all those fuel taxes flowing in, our roads are not getting better.

A recent comprehensive study of Bay Area roads (county by county and city by city) shows we have not made overall gains in road quality. To be sure, some cities have shown remarkable progress and turned their road quality around, but the overall Bay Area's 44,000 miles of roads have not seen much improvement. My conclusion is that with super high fuel excise taxes taking money out of your wallet, you ought to see some improvement in road quality in the Bay Area.

Why are we not seeing better road quality?

Probably because we had ignored the trend for decades before we started repairing our roads with local "self-help" tax measures that have helped. But we have been fighting really bad roads that have cost a lot to fix because they needed total road reconstruction. That is my opinion.

So, are we heading in the right direction?

Nope.

California's funding from gas taxes will drop by nearly \$6 billion in the next decade due to the state's electric car rules and other climate programs, "likely resulting in a decline in highway conditions for drivers," according to a <u>new state analysis released today</u>.

As California phases in major policies aimed at reducing greenhouse gas emissions — such as the mandates for zero-emission cars and trucks — consumers buy less gasoline and diesel, and consequently pay less taxes.

Those declines in tax dollars will be partially offset by the state's road improvement fee, which drivers pay when they register their electric cars. But the Legislative Analyst's Office stressed that overall the state will still see a \$4.4 billion drop in funding, a 31% decline, over a decade, so the Legislature and governor must come up with substantial new funding sources.


I am kind of repeating myself today, but the trend is not our friend!
