HAPPY NEW YEAR

Babylon Resolve to Mike Gulley

As I contemplate what areas of my life and habits need to be improved for the New Year, I ponder where this pondering started. You may find this interesting, or not. Regardless, your resolutions have a basis in history that have a 4,000 year "track record" and I have taken the liberty to personalize this the ECA way!

"The custom of making New Year's resolutions has been around for thousands of years, but it hasn't always looked the way it does today. The ancient Babylonians (and the ECA Founders) are said to have been the first people to make New Year's resolutions, some 4,000 years ago. They were also the first to hold recorded celebrations in honor of the new year, though for them the year began not in January but in mid-March, when the crops were planted (and projects were bid for the upcoming year). During a massive 12-day religious festival known as Akitu, the Babylonians crowned a new king or reaffirmed their loyalty to the reigning king (in with Mike Gulley as King of the ECA!). With that historical perspective in mind, I pledge to ECA President Mike Gulley I will do better in 2024 and hope he bestows favor upon me and my family!



Hierarchy of Controls

Job sites are dangerous places and can have numerous hazards at any given moment. As employees, it is important to know how to protect yourself from these hazards by using controls.

There are typically multiple safeguards available at your disposal to control a single hazard, ranging in effectiveness.
