# Blindfolds the Key to Generational Wealth?

Traditionally, folks in the USA have taken the road of home ownership as the sure, steady, and relatively "bullet proof" way to grow wealth over your lifetime. Oh, sure, some of us have had a huge "helping hand" to move up that wealth ladder from our parents, but many have not and still been able to leave more wealth to their children than they received. Home ownership has, for decades, provided a hedge against inflation, and an incentive to forced equity savings as we saw home values rise year over year even though our mortgage payments stayed stable.

It is a whole new ballgame for young people now.

In the last three years, the average cost of a mortgage payment went from \$1740/month to over \$3400/month while wages stayed the same.

A hidden increase of cost in home ownership has unfortunately, come to our attention in the last year or so. Home insurance premiums. Last year, the big insurers told legislators that they need to increase their rates in a big way to cover fire and flood events that cost the insurers dearly. The State Insurance Commissioner and the Legislature, basically told the insurers that nobody should be uninsured in CA and huge rate increases would be too draconian (Insurance looms as California Legislature nears end of session - CalMatters). Well, the "poker game" was on and the insurers like Allstate, Nationwide, State Farm, and Farmers told State Insurance Commissioner Ricardo Lara, "we will get out of the California market".

If those big insurers left CA, the only remedy was the FAIR ACT which provides insurance in limited coverages for astronomical costs. That wasn't good so Governor Newsom stepped in and kicked the can to Lara who capitulated to the big insurance firms and allowed them to raise rates by 20% or more.

Now, if you are a prospective home buyer, you need to cover an average mortgage cost of \$3400 + /month and proof of insurance that is often too expensive for you to qualify for the home loan.

## **Workplace Violence Program**

Implementation "Target Date" - July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.

## SAFETY TRAINING

## **Confined Space**

Tuesday, January 30 1-3 pm

This course covers proper procedures for making entry into Permit Required Confined Spaces. Participants are prepared to operate in the capacity of Entrant, Attendant or Entry Supervisor during confined space operations. Participants are familiarized with CFR 1910.146 and how to properly employ the permit program. This course is a combination of classroom instruction and practical application in actual permit spaces utilizing the appropriate Personal Protective Equipment, meters and ventilation. This course is required by OSHA before an employee can enter a Permit Required Confined Space. *Certification of completion is provided*.
