Remember-this is an op-ed piece and I do not speak for the ECA or any of its members in this "Soapbox". These are just my ramblings that hopefully you find thought provoking. Remember-these are my opinions, not those of the ECA or any of its member firms.

New Profit Hubs?

I realize it is a difficult decision to open a regional office away from your traditional home office hub, but it has certainly worked as a viable option for other companies. The way we did it at Kirkwood Bly, was we would target a "growth" area, then go after a decent size project in that area after identifying several key employees who were willing to relocate or travel to that area. Once we landed a project that was 1-2 years in duration, we started to look for others in the area and we would get involved in making contacts with local planners and designers to get our name in the loop. Sometimes our "gateway" was private development, sometimes public works. The idea is to take advantage of a 10–15-year opportunity where more development and infrastructure improvements were to be done than near our home base. This allowed us to diversify, open our firm up to new recruitment of young people in that area, and support the entire process from the home office with "local legwork" being done by our "satellite team" in the new office.

As we are still seeing plenty of opportunities in the NorthBay region, this strategy may not be of interest to you. But if you are seeing margins shrink locally, and opportunities constrict for your bidding, it may be something for you to consider. You can certainly start small and see if the profit is available in the new market before you allocate a lot of resources and funding to the concept, but if it works for you, it can create a 10% to 40% growth in your book of business and hopefully that much in your yearend profit after the first two years.



Workplace Violence Program

Implementation "Target Date" - July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.
