CRH is huge. \$34.9 billion in revenue in 2023, 78,500 employees in 29 countries. #1 in America in asphalt and #3 in cement, and overall, CRH is the leading provider of building materials solutions in North America.

After a brief discussion with ownership, during which I congratulated them upon their sale which will open opportunities for Dean, Bo, Troy, and Dawn to travel more and have a less stressful next period in their lives, I look at the sale as an opportunity to continue business as usual but under new leadership. I asked whether there should be trepidation as to the impact on the local market and industry from the sale, and after a brief discussion, I feel we will not see dramatic changes in our local market pricing and supply.

We have seen some major ownership changes over the last few years. V. Dolan purchased by Toby's.

BoDean and Northgate Ready Mix purchased by CRH.

Ghilotti Construction Company becoming 100% employee owned.

Syar/Shamrock purchased by Vulcan.

NorthBay Construction was purchased by Ghilotti Construction Company. Roblar Road Quarry purchased by an ownership group including majority owner Jim Ratto.

NEWS YOU CAN USE

1. **New Classification news on independent contractors vs employees-**Is that worker still an independent contractor? A new rule goes into effect.

A new rule from the U.S. Department of Labor is broadly expected to result in more workers being classified as "employees" under the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA). Although the final rule faces challenges in court, the rule on independent contractor classification took effect on March 11, 2024. Employers should review their relationships with workers currently classified as independent contractors to determine if they should be re-classified as employees. Misclassification could result in significant liability for unpaid wages (including unpaid overtime), employee benefits, unpaid employment, and other taxes. Learn more.

2. Organizing Strategy?? Contractors object to new safety inspection rule

Construction employees will be allowed to have third-party representatives on hand during safety inspections under a new rule issued by the Department of Labor over the objections of contractors. The rule, which takes effect May 31, "essentially forces contractors to allow anyone -- regardless of their safety training and experience -- onto active jobsites," says Brian Turmail, vice president of public affairs and strategic initiatives for the Associated General Contractors of America. 3. Slide Repair-Teichert picked to tackle Calif. Highway 1 washout.

Sacramento-based Teichert has been tapped to carry out \$1 million in initial stabilization and safety work to clear an Easter weekend washout on Highway 1 near Big Sur. Workplace Violence Program

Implementation "Target Date" - July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.



California's New Workplace Violence Prevention Requirements

No later than July 1, 2024, covered California employers must implement extensive workplace violence prevention plans (WVPP) and deliver specified training to employees under new legislation signed by Governor Gavin Newsom on September 30, 2023. In order to comply on time – including preparing plans that are "specific to the hazards and corrective measures <u>for each work area</u>" as required – employers will need to prepare early.

Senate Bill 533 adds section 6401.9 to the California Labor Code. The legislation is intended to help employers prevent and respond effectively to workplace violence.

Covered employers must deliver the training to all employees no later than July 1, 2024, and annually thereafter.
