CEQA The Deck is Stacked

I This Soapbox has plagiarized a recent op-ed piece by Dick Spotswood, who writes for the Marin IJ:



Launched in 1970 with the most honorable of intentions, CEQA was co-authored by a Richmond Democrat, Assemblymember Jack Knox, a legislative giant. It was signed by then Gov. Ronald Reagan at a time when even conservative Republicans wanted to improve the environment.

Over the decades, due to legislative expansion and court rulings, CEQA moved far from its original goals. Its idea was to make certain that negative environmental impacts potentially incurred by new infrastructure would be spotted, then eliminated or appropriately mitigated.

Today, CEQA is abused to near uselessness. Special interests use the law not to learn if a project might produce environmental harm, but to delay and make prohibitively expensive housing and infrastructure projects that potentially could benefit rank-and-file Californians.

The most effective opposition to reforming CEQA comes not from the green activists but from organized labor particularly the building trade unions. They have real clout among the Democrats legislative supermajority to block change they oppose. The unions use CEQA as a vehicle to file lawsuits and administrative appeals that delay the planning process. The claim is invariably that the review performed was "inadequate." The upshot is building anything becomes far more expensive and takes years not months longer.

These litigation-minded unions are happy to make deals. The infrastructure project's private sector backers well know that their opposition evaporates if they exclusively employ union labor.


Why can we not keep CEQA to do the good it was designed to do, and eliminate the parts that are a disadvantage to needed development?

Workplace Violence Program

Implementation "Target Date" - July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.

CALIFORNIA'S NEW WORKPLACE VIOLENCE PREVENTION REQUIREMENTS

No later than July 1, 2024, covered California employers must implement extensive workplace violence prevention plans (WVPP) and deliver specified training to employees under new legislation signed by Governor Gavin Newsom on September 30, 2023. In order to comply on time – including preparing plans that are "specific to the hazards and corrective measures <u>for each work area</u>" as required – employers will need to prepare early.

Senate Bill 533 adds section 6401.9 to the California Labor Code. The legislation is intended to help employers prevent and respond effectively to workplace violence.

Covered employers must deliver the training to all employees no later than July 1, 2024, and annually thereafter.


