

Why Is Suicide So Prevalent in Construction?



Construction workers—men in particular—are committing suicide at a rate that's 75% higher than the general population, according to the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention</u>. It's a number that keeps climbing.

According to the CDC, male construction workers have the highest rate of suicide—53 per 100,000—which is five times higher than any other industry. An estimated 6,000 died in 2022.

That is sobering. Higher than public safety? I am astounded by that number. I am no psychologist, but I do like to think about the stories behind the headlines so I want to write a bit about why the construction industry suicide rate might be so high.

"You know, men aren't always as willing to talk or share what's going on. So, they start to bottle up some of those emotions. There's like this toughness culture within construction," said Angela Crawford, executive director of Construction Suicide Prevention Week.

Angela Crawford heads up Construction Suicide Prevention Week, an effort that started four years ago to bring awareness to the issue. She said a number of factors lead to mental health issues in construction, including injury, time away from family, and substance abuse.

I am human. I read these stories/articles, and I try to relate to my own experience in the industry. For me, several of the factors cited by Angela Crawford were prevalent in my career:

Time away from home. I realize most of the ECA members do not have a work schedule like I did. 85% of my career was spent away from home. My company, Kirkwood Bly (now Western Water) had a business plan that focused on projects away from Santa Rosa. We would get a treatment plant project in Magalia, or in Fresno, or in Santa Cruz and our project manager had to be on site M-F, every week. This is not conducive to a good family life of course. Hmm-perhaps that has something to do with me being divorced? Of course it does. Most ECA men do not have that extreme of a commitment to be away from home, but certainly the demand of running a project necessitates long hours on site several hours away from home. Similar isolation from what I experienced and lots of work pressure to "get the job done" is also quite similar. Dealing with trying to "be there" for your family while trying to get the project completed for your company brings direct stress and lends itself to uncertainty in the homelife area as well.

I know we tried to accommodate the travel as best we could. From chartering airplanes for the Friday trip home, to the Sunday night trip from home to the project site, to providing a company vehicle and having a policy that basically was "you should not have to spend any more money to live and be housed out of town that you would if you were working from home".

However, we did not deal with the family strife and the pressures of being isolated from your wife and children enough in my opinion.

How did some of us deal with the isolation?

That is **where substance abuse** comes in. Although I was never a regular user of drugs, I certainly got into a pattern of having a few drinks after work before or during dinner. That pattern led to other issues that were not particularly healthy. For some, I could see falling into an unhealthy lifestyle that could lead to hiding some things you were tempted to do from your family, friends and even coworkers. Any kind of isolation and "hiding" behavior has the possibility of becoming a disorder in the depression area.

I firmly believe the "macho" culture of construction workers combined with being away from family can lead to the problems that lead to suicide. If we have projects that are very stressful, very time-consuming which lead to extended hours away from family and friends and even other coworkers, these are the situations that need our attention in our industry. Maybe it is as simple as being aware and making the effort to foster discussion with those in our firms that have these highly intense projects that demand time. Maybe some situations need some professional consulting of some sort. I do know that the statistics of our industry being five times more likely to see a male suicide than ANY OTHER INDUSTRY, says something needs to change.

Make mental health and open communication about stress and isolation a part of your safety program. It just might make a difference!

Workplace Violence Program

Implemented - July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.


