## Criminal Sentences. Misdemeanor Penalties. Initiative Statute.

Requires misdemeanor sentence instead of felony for certain drug and property offenses. Inapplicable to persons with prior conviction for serious or violent crime and registered sex offenders. Fiscal Impact: State and county criminal justice savings potentially in the high hundreds of millions of dollars annually. State savings spent on school truancy and dropout prevention, mental health and substance abuse treatment, and victim services.

Voters were told by Prop 47 co-author George Gascon (the very controversial District Attorney of Los Angeles), that trying to treat addiction and drug dealers and drug users by putting them in jail is the wrong approach. Voters in California "bought" this opinion to the tune of voting yes on Prop 47 59.61% to 40.39%. Now, after 10 years, many voters in California are "pissed off" that drug dealers and drug users and thiefs and many other criminals are not serving jail time for their illegal actions. Many are thinking that appeasement and being soft on crime is not doing our communities any good at all.

Prop 36 has been drafted to "correct" many of the "soft on crime" results Californians have seen from Prop 47 being passed in 2014. Prop 36 would strengthen criminal penalties for repeat offenders involving retail theft and fentanyl possession. Democratic Gov. Gavin Newsom has come out against the measure, which has also been the target of criminal justice reform and drug treatment advocates.

Whether you are a democrat or republican, whether you work in our ECA industry or in professional sports (note the shooting on Ricky Pearsall in San Francisco a few months ago), we are <u>all</u> affected by the lawlessness in California and the easy or non-existent jail sentences for many that are making us all unsafe. Whether you believe that putting offenders in jail will solve addiction problems, or simply punish the offenders, we are all living with the effects of the soft on crime prop 47 that lets these criminals roam free rather than serve time.

It is time to change that tune.

A personal story about the soft on crime judicial system in California. Last week I spoke with an old friend that some of you may know - Jerry Minton. Although Jerry and I had served on the NCBE Board together for many years, Jerry moved to Oregon several years ago and we lost touch with each other. Reconnected, he shared with me his tragic loss of his daughter to a fentanyl overdose. A beautiful young lady about to graduate from college and starting her journey, she was no different than many in their young years regarding dabbling in substances that enhance or alter the social interaction in college get togethers. Regrettably for her, a dealer gave her fentanyl and she apparently had no idea she was being exposed to it and it ended her young life.

Many, including her father, would consider this murder or at least manslaughter for the drug supplier. Yet, after years of trying to reach justice for his daughter's life, this guy will serve 3 months in jail for killing Jerry's daughter.

Think how any of us would feel if that were our child.

Jerry asked me to simply do one thing when I expressed my sympathy and asked if there was anything I could do. He asked me to promote Prop 36 for him.

Well, Jerry, your "ask" is being responded to in this Soapbox.

For Jerry's daughter, for your own children's and grandchildren's sake, let's put these assholes in jail for a lot longer than prop 47 requires-get real about protecting our children and vote yes on Prop 36.

VOTE YES ON PROP 36-

PLFASE!

If you think this does not affect the general engineering contracting industry, think again as we face increasing theft of our equipment, our materials, and our personal freedom as we simply try to walk or ride on a public sidewalk these days. Drug use is everywhere and appeasing the drug users is not working. We must help to save our communities and put these murderers in jail-for a long time!

It is agreed that trucking will not be included in the new County PLA!! This is a tribute to those that bravely stood up and wrote or spoke on behalf of the trucking industry and material suppliers a few months ago-thank to Kevin Ghilotti, Wendell Trappe, Jeff Roades, Kimber Carpenter, and others that expressed their opinion that trucking should not be a part of the PLA for Sonoma County. ## **Workplace Violence Program**

Implemented - July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.


