Thanks Dad-and Thanks to Richard Nixon for Father’s Day

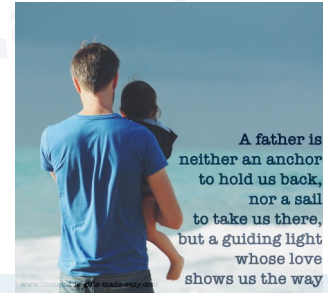
On June 15, 2025, the United States will celebrate Father’s Day.

Father's Day was originally founded in [Spokane, Washington](#), at the [YMCA](#) in 1910 by Sonora Smart Dodd. Its first celebration was in the Spokane YMCA on June 19, 1910. Sonora Smart Dodd’s father, the [Civil War](#) veteran William Jackson Smart, was a single parent who raised his six children there. After hearing a sermon about [Anna Jarvis’](#) Mother’s Day at Central Methodist Episcopal Church in 1909, she told her pastor that fathers should have a similar holiday honoring them. Although she initially suggested June 5, her father’s birthday, the pastors of the Spokane Ministerial Alliance did not have enough time to prepare their sermons, and the celebration was deferred to the third Sunday of June.

Americans resisted the holiday at first, perceiving it as just [an attempt by merchants to replicate the commercial success](#) of Mother’s Day, and newspapers frequently featured cynical and sarcastic attacks and jokes. But the trade groups did not give up: they kept promoting it and even incorporated the jokes into their adverts, and they eventually succeeded. By the mid-1980s, the Father’s Council wrote that "(...) [Father’s Day] has become a Second Christmas for all the men’s gift-oriented industries."

A bill to accord national recognition of the holiday was introduced in Congress in 1913. In 1916, President [Woodrow Wilson](#) went to Spokane to speak at a Father’s Day celebration¹ and wanted to make it official, but Congress resisted, fearing that it would become commercialized. US President [Calvin Coolidge](#) recommended in 1924 that the day be observed by the nation but stopped short of issuing a national proclamation. Two earlier attempts to formally recognize the holiday had been defeated by Congress. In 1957, Maine Senator [Margaret Chase Smith](#) wrote a proposal accusing Congress of ignoring fathers for 40 years while honoring mothers, thus "[singling] out just one of our two parents" In 1966, President [Lyndon B. Johnson](#) issued the first presidential proclamation honoring fathers, designating the third Sunday in June as Father’s Day. Six years later, the day was made a permanent national holiday when President [Richard Nixon](#) signed it into law on April 24, 1972.

Workplace Violence Program

Implemented – July 1, 2024

Senate Bill 553 requires employers to create, implement and maintain a Workplace Violence Program by July 1, 2024. Employers must also train their entire workforce.

The Workplace Violence Program must include a reporting mechanism (how is the employee going to report incidents), detailing who will be responsible for receiving complaints, and who will be responsible for identifying and mitigating workplace hazards.

Jim Persons has developed a Workplace Violence Program and Active Shooter Guidelines that meet the requirements of this new regulation. He can also provide training resources for your employees.

Training The Next Generation of Construction Workers

The North Bay Construction Corps (NBCC) is an after-school, 3-month basic construction training program for seniors in their last semester of high school. Classes are taught by local contractors and construction managers. Participants are introduced to a variety of trades and earn certifications in Personal Protective Equipment and CPR/First Aid.

Each meeting is led by a contractor or tradesperson who presents information about his/her particular trade and then leads students through a hands-on skill-building activity. There is a strong focus on safety awareness at each meeting.

Attachments: 8.2 Staff Report Attachment 1 – Redlined Version – Draft Revised Public Storm Drain Standards Attachment 2 – Simplified Redlined Version – Draft Revised Public Storm Drain Standards Attachment 3 - Proposed Storm Drain Standard Details Attachment 4 - Clean - Draft Revised Public Storm Drain Standards REPORT - UPDATE TO 2018 WATER AND SEWER STANDARDS AND SPECIFICATIONS BACKGROUND: Santa Rosa Water’s Design and Construction Standards (Standards) provide the specifications for designing and constructing additions and modifications to the public water and sewer systems. In October of 2018, the Board, via Resolution No. 1180, last approved an update to Santa Rosa Water’s current Standards. Santa Rosa Water was a participant in U.S. et al., ex rel. Hendrix v. J M Manufacturing Co., Inc., et al., Case No. EDCV 06 0055 GW (C.D. of CA) (“Action”), and therefore, the current Standards include a restriction on the use of PVC pipe manufactured by J M Manufacturing and JM Eagle. In May 2025, the City entered into an agreement settling the Action, and the settlement requires the City to remove the restrictions on J M Manufacturing and JM Eagle. RECOMMENDATION: It is recommended by Santa Rosa Water and the City Attorney’s Office that the Board of Public Utilities, by resolution, approve updates to the Water Distribution System Design Standards, the Water Distribution System Construction Standard Specifications, and the Sanitary Sewer System Construction Standard Specifications, removing the restricted use of J M Manufacturing or JM Eagle pipe.
